Diphenhydramine is an antihistamine used in both humans and pets. The most commonly known diphenhydramine for humans is Benadryl®. An equivalent product manufactured specifically for dogs and cats is known as Vetadryl[®].

Veterinarians rely on diphenhydramine for managing conditions such as motion sickness and as an aid in both allergy management and atopic dermatitis (itchy skin). But it's important to ensure proper precautions and accurate dosing for your pet when managing these conditions, as advised by your veterinarian.

Be sure to have your pet weighed during the appointment and ask your veterinarian for dosing recommendations.



During your visit, consider the questions below to discuss with your veterinarian prior to administering a diphenhydramine product such as Vetadryl[®]:

- 1 How does diphenhydramine work?
- 2 Will my dog be sleepy after receiving diphenhydramine?
- Should it be given with food?
- 4 Are there any side effects to giving this to my dog or cat?
- 5 How often can I administer diphenhydramine each day?
- 6 Are there any contraindications to administering diphenhydramine to my pet based upon their exam, including *if they received any vaccines?*
